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# **DILANTIN**

## WHAT IS THE DRUGS GENERIC (PHARMACISTS) NAME? Phenytoin

#### WHAT IS THE DRUG USED FOR?

The treatment of epilepsy(seizures). Abnormal heart rythmn. Treatment of some pain syndromes.

## HOW DOES THE DRUG WORK?

The primary action in the treatment of epilepsy is to prevent the spread of seizure activity in the motor part of the brain. It does this by stabilising the cell wall of the neuron.

## **HOW LONG BEFORE IT WORKS?**

This depends on lots of factors but the drug does not reach a stable concentration in the body till about one week

## HOW DO WE KNOW THAT YOU ARE GETTING **ENOUGH?**


We will do blood levels on a regular basis to check that you are getting enough and not too much. The first level is usually done at about one week.

## **CAN I CHANGE MY DOSE?**

This may be possible but you should not change your dose unless instructed by your doctor or if you develop a possible side effect. In which case you should immediatley stop the medication while contacting your doctor. Stopping abruptly can cause a seizure.

## WHAT ARE THE TABLET STRENGTHS AND WHAT SHOULD MY TABLETS LOOK LIKE?

30 mg 100 mg white capsule





## HOW MUCH/HOW LONG AND WHEN DO I TAKE IT?

This is decided by your doctor but you are usually started on 300mg a day divided into 2-3 doses with a glass of water or after food. After your blood level the dose may be changed. If you run out of tablets this does not mean that you should stop so check with your doctor.

## WHAT DRUGS INTERACT WITH DILANTIN?

There are many drugs that can increase or decrease the blood levels, once you are stable if you change any medication you should check with your pharmacist and you may need to recheck your dilantin levels.

## WHAT SHOULD I TELL THE DOCTOR BEFORE I TAKE THIS NEW MEDICATION?

If you have had a reaction to this drug in the past.

If you are pregnant(or breast feeding) or planning a pregnancy.

Any medical conditions especially

kidney disease Low blood pressure

heart Failure Porphyria

liver disease

## WHAT ARE SOME OF THE SIDE EFFECTS

Allergic symptoms of breathlessness or rash.

Severe skin reaction.

Thickening of the gums

Coarsening of facial features

Liver damage(and abnormal liver tests)

Osteomalacia

Overdose

Slurred speach **Drowsiness** Difficulty walking Nausea/vomiting Confusion Visual problems

#### WHAT DO I DO IF I THINK I HAVE A SIDE EFFECT

As a general rule contact your doctor immediately and do not take any medication while waiting. Some side effects are life threatening and if any of the below occur it is important to present to a hospital emergency immediately

Asthma/sudden shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.

Severe rash

Swelling of face /lips/hands/throat.

Chest pain

Any of the overdose symptoms
